**Season Opener: Double Bill with meal**

Saturday 7th September 3.45pm

Two brilliant films with stunning lead performances kick off our new season. Both are based on true stories of journalists working for the Washington Post in the 1970s.



First is the 2017 film *The Post*. Starring Meryl Streep and Tom Hanks as the country's first female newspaper publisher and her hard driven editor. When they discover evidence of US government duplicity over the facts surrounding the Vietnam War they must decide whether to back down for the safety of the Post, or publish and fight for the freedom of the press.

After our meal *All The President's Men* from 1977 stars Robert Redford & Dustin Hoffman as reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein. Winner of Best Film in the Oscars, Golden Globes and BAFTAs, it tells how they uncovered details of the Watergate scandal that led to the resignation of President Nixon.



**First Man (2018)**

Thursday 19th September 7.30pm



Fifty years ago man stepped onto the moon – Neil Armstrong. *First Man* depicts the journey from test pilot to Apollo, exploring the sacrifices and cost on him and his family over the eight years leading up to this historic moment, the most dangerous mission in the history of space travel.

Starring Ryan Gosling as Armstrong and Claire Foy as his wife.

**The Keeper (2018)**

Thursday 31st October 7.30pm

This tells the extraordinary love story between a young English woman and a German Prisoner of War who together overcome prejudice, public hostility and personal tragedy. Bert Trautmann is a talented goal keeper and after the war signs for Manchester City, causing outrage to thousands of their football fans, including many Jews. Bert secures victory for Manchester City at the 1956 FA Cup Final despite playing with a broken neck.



**L'amant Double (French with subtitles) (2017)** Thursday 21st November 7.30pm



Disenchanted with the glamour of the modelling world, Chloe, a vulnerable young Parisian woman, begins psychotherapy and soon falls in love with Paul, her psychoanalyst. After moving in with him she discovers that he is concealing part of his identity and there is more to him than meets the eye. This is a stylish film playing a game of mirrors, with lots of twists and turns and full of suspense. Directed by Francois Ozon.

### Fisherman's Friends (2019)

Thursday 12th December 7.30pm

Based on true events and set in beautiful coastal Cornwall, this charming gentle comedy – with wonderful folk music – is our pre-Christmas feel-good movie choice that will leave you smiling from start to finish. It is the story of ten fishermen who are signed by Universal Records and achieve a top ten hit with their debut album of Sea Shanties. A film that highlights the little things that matter most such as friends, family, love and loyalty.



### Stan and Ollie (2018)

Thursday 30th January 7.30pm



This film about Hollywood's greatest comedy double act, Laurel and Hardy, is the heart warming story of the pair's 1950s tour of variety halls in Britain and Ireland. With their golden era long behind them, the duo comes to the realisation that they are approaching their swan song, forcing them to acknowledge what they mean to each other. With stunning performances by Steve Coogan and John C. Reilly.

### Winter special: Double Bill with meal

We have two Jack Lemmon films to lift us from the gloom of winter!

We start with the hilarious *The Odd Couple* (1968), starring Lemmon with Walter Matthau, two friends who try to share an apartment but their ideas on housekeeping and lifestyles are as different as night and day. Based on Neil Simon's play, this brilliant pair of actors are perfectly matched and the film, though moving at times, is funny from start to finish – a rare comic gem.


Saturday 1st February 4pm



After our meal we have *The Apartment* (1960), winner of seven Oscars and numerous other awards.

Lemmon plays mild mannered office worker C.C. Baxter. Why can't he get into his apartment, so works late night every night?

Described as one of the finest examples of smart satiric comedy-drama ever created for the screen; its promotional poster says it all - "There has never been anything like this – love-wise, laugh-wise, or other-wise!"



### Oscar Night: Green Book (2018)

Sunday 9th February 7.30pm

To coincide with Hollywood's Academy Awards ceremony, we are showing the 2019 winner of Best Motion Picture Oscar, *Green Book*.



Tough and uncouth Tony, an out of work Italian-American bouncer, takes the job of chauffeur to sophisticated African-American classical pianist, Don, for a concert tour of the Deep South. They are armed with The Negro Motorist Green Book to guide them through safe travel routes in America's 1960s racial segregation. From initial dislike and a clash of values, this disparate pair forge a special relationship as they witness and endure appalling injustices on the road.

### The Breadwinner (2017)

Thursday 27th February 7.30pm

To conclude the first part of our season we have a highly acclaimed animated drama which tells the story of an eleven year old girl in 2001 Taliban controlled Afghanistan. When her father is wrongfully arrested she determines to provide for her family, so disguises herself as a boy – and discovers a new world of freedom and danger. A film that is thrilling and enchanting in equal measure.
