



Charlie Bubbles (1968)

Thursday 26th March 7.30 pm

Viewed by some as one of the finest British films of the sixties, Albert Finney gives a brilliant performance as a writer from working class Manchester who quickly achieves riches and fame, yet somehow sits uncomfortably with his new plush lifestyle. The cast includes Liza Minnelli in her first film role, and Billie Whitelaw who won a BAFTA as Best Supporting Actress. Locations include Manchester and Edale. The writer's journey north to visit his estranged wife and son accidentally

becomes an attempt to re-engage with life, people and his own history. This delightful comedy drama is directed by Albert Finney.


Spring Double Bill with meal

Saturday 25th April 3.45 pm

We are travelling to the exoticism of India, with the chance of a curry (or not) meal between!

First on the menu is **Heat and Dust (1983)**

A wonderfully compelling story of two women in different eras being captivated by India. Modern day Anne travels to India to investigate the intriguing and scandalous life of her grand-aunt Olivia, who after marrying Douglas, a civil servant in the colonial administration, joins him in India in the early 1920s. Anne and Olivia's stories are intertwined, and Anne's journey begins to parallel that of her aunt.



Starring Greta Scacchi and Julie Christie, the film has an evocative musical score and wonderful BAFTA winning cinematography.

After our meal, we are showing

Monsoon Wedding (2001)

Set in the modern upper-middle class of India where Western lifestyle mixes with old tradition. A stressed father, a bride-to-be with a secret, a smitten event planner, and relatives from around the world create much ado about the preparations for an arranged marriage. With lots of music – and the threat of rain!

Roma (Spanish, with subtitles) (2018)

Thursday 30th April 7.30 pm


Winner of Best Foreign Language Film Oscar last year, this is a powerful and at times emotionally draining drama. It spans a year in the life of a middle class family in Mexico City in the early 1970s. Dr Antonio and Sofia have four children, and two domestic workers, one of whom is Cleo, the live-in maid and housekeeper. With Antonio running off with his mistress, and Cleo finding herself pregnant, the lives of Cleo and Sophia, her academic employer, become inextricably intertwined as a seemingly ordinary business trip to Quebec paves the way for bitter heartbreak.



Yesterday (2019)

Tuesday 26th May 7.30 pm

A struggling musician, Jack Malik, realises he is the only person on Earth who can remember The Beatles, after waking up in an alternative timeline where they never existed! There's plenty of Beatles' music as Jack claims their songs as his own, rocketing him to stardom. But there comes a point when he must make a fundamental moral decision about his music. This endearing fantasy comedy stars Lily James and Himesh Patel, and is directed by Danny Boyle.



The Farewell (Mandarin, with subtitles) (2019)

Tuesday 30th June 7.30 pm


This bitter-sweet Chinese tragi-comedy perfectly balances emotion and humour. It is the story of a Chinese-American woman, Billi, returning to China when her beloved grandmother is dying. But the family decides to keep the knowledge of her terminal condition from the grandmother, and to stage a wedding so that they can all see her one last time. Described as 'captivating', it is a beautiful portrayal of a long farewell, giving an insight into the differences between western and eastern culture. The film has featured highly in the 2020 awards season.



The Old Man and the Gun (2018)

Thursday 30th July 7.30 pm

The swansong of a movie legend, Robert Redford, this film is based on the true story of Forrest Tucker, whose audacious escape from San Quentin at the age of 70 is followed by an unprecedented string of heists that confounded authorities and enchanted the public! In pursuit is detective John Hunt (Casey Affleck) who becomes captivated with Forrest's commitment to his craft, and a woman who loves him in spite of his chosen profession (Sissy Spacek). "A touching, funny, romantic bank heist trip", perfectly performed by this great actor.



Rocketman (2019)

Thursday 27th August 7.30 pm

With music galore, this film moves from the 50s to the early 80s in the life of Elton John, showing his difficult early years, and struggles with emotional instability and depression. Described as a 'dazzlingly executed' musical in its truest sense, it portrays a very real and human, yet flawed, man who achieves international stardom and happiness. Rocketman won a BAFTA for Outstanding British Picture of the Year, and Taron Egerton's brilliant portrayal of the star won him a Golden Globe and a BAFTA.

Our next season will open with a Double Bill with meal on Saturday 5th September.
