Knives Out (2019)

Thur. 30th September 7.30pm




With a stellar cast (Daniel Craig, Christopher Plummer, Don Johnson, Toni Collette to name a few), this Comedy / Crime / Thriller will transport us into a world of red herrings and unfathomable clues. Inspired by Agatha Christie's typical trademarking and set in her favourite enormous mansion, writer/director Rian Johnson (Oscar nominee) pays tribute to her most legendary characters. But the plot of *Knives Out* is entirely new, with convoluted twists and turns, as a fabulous all-knowing but slightly odd sleuth slowly unravels the clues.

The Old Man and the Gun (2018)

The swansong of a movie legend, Robert Redford, this film is based on the true story of Forrest Tucker, whose audacious escape from San Quentin at the age of 70 is followed by an unprecedented string of heists that confounded authorities and enchanted the public! In pursuit is detective John Hunt (Casey Affleck) who becomes captivated with Forrest's commitment to his craft, and a woman who loves him in spite of his chosen profession (Sissy Spacek). "A touching, funny, romantic bank heist trip", perfectly performed by this great actor.




Woman at War (Icelandic, with subtitles) (2018) Thur. 25th November 7.30pm

A striking portrait of a modern times female warrior, environmental activist Halla. Halla is a 50 year old independent woman who leads a double life, secretly waging a one-woman-war against the local aluminium industry to protect the pristine Icelandic Highlands she loves. But as she plans her biggest and boldest operation, a letter arrives that changes everything, and an orphan from Ukraine enters her life. 'Gentle, bold and with a glimpse of humour'.



Rocketman (2019)

Thur. 16th December 7.30pm




With music galore, this film moves from the 50s to the early 80s in the life of Elton John, showing his difficult early years, and struggles with emotional instability and depression. Described as a 'dazzlingly executed' musical in its truest sense, it portrays a very real and human, yet flawed, man who achieves international stardom and happiness. *Rocketman* won a BAFTA for Outstanding British Picture of the Year, and Taron Egerton's brilliant portrayal of the star won him a Golden Globe and a BAFTA.

It's a Beautiful Day in the Neighbourhood (2019) Thur. 27th January 7.30pm

Starring Tom Hanks and Matthew Rhys, this is the heart warming true story of goodness triumphing over cynicism.

Fred Rogers is a much loved TV host of children's programmes. Tom Junod is a jaded magazine writer who is none too pleased when he is assigned a profile of 'Mister' Rogers. But his scepticism turns to respect as he encounters empathy, kindness and decency from America's most beloved neighbour.



Parasite (Korean, with subtitles) (2019) Thur. 10th February 7.30pm



The Kims are a family in Seoul who reek of poverty. The Parks are a wealthy family, and are all about status. These two worlds collide when Ki-woo Kim's student friend Min recommends him as a tutor to the Parks' teenage daughter, encouraging him to lie about his education. And so begins a colossal scam as the Kims seek to become their version of the Parks. This is a quality comedy drama that won four Oscars in 2020, including the coveted Best Picture Award.

OSCAR NIGHT Nomadland (2020)

Thur. 3rd March 7.30pm

Again we are celebrating Oscar Night in our own special way, with the 2021 winner, *Nomadland*, starring Frances McDormand. Fern, a widow in her sixties, faces ruin, along with her entire town in Nevada, when the local Gypsum Plant closes. Faced with a bleak economic future, she crams her scanty belongings into a beat-up second hand van, becoming a modern day nomad searching for work, and exploring a life outside conventional society.
