


PLEASE NOTE: Our films are usually on the last Thursday of the month but dates are subject to change as live events take precedence. Please check our website for up to date information.

Lilies of the Field (1963) Thur. 31st March 7:30pm

As a tribute to Sidney Poitier we have chosen the film that won him the Oscar for Best Actor. *Lilies of the Field* tells the story of Homer Smith, an unemployed construction worker, and a group of East European nuns whose lives come together when he stops at a remote farm in the desert to get water when his car overheats. The farm is being worked by the nuns, headed by the strict Mother Maria, who believes Homer has been sent by God to build a much needed church in the desert. "A fascinating, quiet film perfectly acted". Winner of Best Picture Oscar in 1963.



Antonia's Line (1995) (Dutch with subtitles) Thur. 28th April 7:30pm


A quirky and whimsical story with themes on love, family and community. Winner of the Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film Gently exploring topics on feminism and liberalism through the independent Antonia who, following World War 2, returns to the village of her birth when her mother leaves her a farm. Here she establishes and nurtures a close knit but unusual community. Described as a comedy/drama.

We are travelling to the exoticism of India. First on the menu is **Heat and Dust (1983)** A wonderfully compelling story of two women in different eras being captivated by India. Modern day Anne travels to India to investigate the intriguing and scandalous life of her grand-aunt Olivia, who after marrying Douglas, a civil servant in the colonial administration, joins him in India in the early 1920s. Anne and Olivia's stories are intertwined, and Anne's journey begins to parallel that of her aunt.

Set in the modern upper-middle class of India where Western lifestyle mixes with old tradition. A stressed father, a bride-to-be with a secret, a smitten event planner, and relatives from around the world create much ado about the preparations for an arranged marriage.

Tuesday 24th May 7:30pm


This is the extraordinary and inspiring true story of Harriet Tubman's escape from slavery, and her transformation into one of America's greatest heroes.

Her courage, ingenuity and tenacity freed hundreds of slaves and helped to change the course of history. Cynthia Erivo, who plays Harriet, was nominated for an Oscar for her outstanding performance.




Charlie Bubbles (1968)

Thursday 30th June 7:30pm



Viewed by some as one of the finest British films of the sixties, Albert Finney gives a brilliant performance as a writer from working class Manchester who quickly achieves riches and fame, yet somehow sits uncomfortably with his new plush lifestyle. The writer's journey north to visit his estranged wife and son becomes an attempt to re-engage with life, people and his own history. Locations include Manchester and Edale, and the cast includes Liza Minnelli in her first film role, and Billie Whitelaw who won a BAFTA as Best Supporting Actress. This delightful comedy drama is directed by Albert Finney.



The French Dispatch (2021)

Thursday 28th July 7:30pm

This comes highly recommended, and is described as 'a love letter to journalists'. Arthur Howitzer Jr., editor of American The French Dispatch magazine based in a fictional French city, dies suddenly from a heart attack. According to the wishes of his will, publication of the newspaper is immediately suspended – following one final issue in which articles from past editions are republished along with his obituary. Listed as a comedy/drama/romance, the cast is brimming with stars including Benicio Del Toro, Tilda Swinton, Frances McDormand and Bill Murray.

No Time to Die (2021)

Thursday 25th August 7:30pm

Daniel Craig's thrilling last outing as 007 is a 'must' for all James Bond fans.

Portrayed as a serious and credible human being, the story line is strong, and he is again joined by Ralph Fiennes (M), Naomie Harris (Moneypenny) and Ben Wilshaw (Q). Bond has left the service and is enjoying a tranquil life in Jamaica – until his old CIA friend Felix asks for his help in finding a kidnapped scientist. This (of course!) turns out to be more treacherous than expected and leads Bond onto the trail of a mysterious villain armed with dangerous new technology. BAFTA nominated No Time to Die as The Outstanding British Film of the Year.
