Double Bill with meal

Sat. 24th September 4:15pm to 9:15pm

Northern Ireland and Scotland are the settings for this special event to launch the new season.

First on the menu is the Oscar winning 2021 **Belfast**, written and directed by Kenneth Branagh, semi-autobiographical and thought to be one of his best films. The story follows a young boy's childhood amidst the Troubles of the late 1960s, as he tries to make sense of the sectarian conflict erupting around him.



After our meal we are in Scotland for the delightful 1983 film **Local Hero**.

An American Oil Company has plans for a new refinery and wants to buy up an entire village. Some locals are thrilled at the thought of the 'silver dollar', but things don't go as expected. Used to his sophisticated Houston office, when Mac arrives to sort things out he is forced to negotiate on very different terms with local hermit and beach scavenger Ben Knox.

Another Mother's Son (2017)

Thur. 29th September 7:30pm

Based on a true story, the drama is set during World War II on the Nazi occupied island of Jersey. Louisa takes in an escaped Russian POW and hides him over the course of the war. Tensions mount and community spirit begins to fray under pressures of hunger, occupation and divided loyalty, but Louisa is determined to protect the Russian boy as if he were her own son. Jenny Seagrove stars as Louisa Gould.



Le Diner de Cons (1998) (French with subtitles) **Thur. 27th October 7:30pm**



A group of wealthy friends have a weekly dinner where they each bring a 'dimwit' guest who is invited to talk about his pastime. The members are competing to introduce the champion idiot. Pierre thinks he has found a winner, but things do not go as he had hoped. Described as funny, witty and intelligent – and extremely enjoyable.

Radioactive (2019)

Based on the book 'Radioactive: Marie and Pierre Curie. A Tale of Love and Fallout'. The film tells the remarkable story of Marie Curie and her Nobel Prize winning work that changed the world. Starring Rosamund Pike as this great woman of science.

The Blues Brothers (1980)



A film rich with comedy and music, a true classic. Two corrupt brothers race to save a school run by the nun who raised them – they have 11 days to raise \$5000. They plan to stage a Big Gig, and make plenty of friends (and enemies) along the way. 'A side-busting movie!' Starring John Belushi and Dan Aykroyd – and more famous musicians than you can shake a tail feather at...

Double Bill with meal

Our Winter Special is a comedy double. We start the afternoon with Cary Grant starring in the 1940 **His Girl Friday**. A newspaper editor uses every trick in the book to keep his ace reporter ex-wife from remarrying. She arrives at work with news she is quitting, and leaving that afternoon to marry a straight-laced insurance agent. A slick and wonderful comedy from the early days of film.



After the meal, we have the Coen brothers' 2016 **Hail Caesar**. A star studded extravaganza (including Scarlett Johansson, Josh Brolin, George Clooney and Ralph Fiennes). The film follows a day in the life of Eddie, a Hollywood fixer in the 1950s who cleans up and solves problems for stars in the industry. But when one of the studio stars disappears, he has to deal with more than the fix.

Just Mercy (2019)

A powerful and thought-provoking true story. It follows young lawyer Bryan Stevenson (Michael B Jordan) in his history making battle for justice as he works to free a wrongly condemned death row prisoner (Jamie Foxx). With phenomenal acting, this is an emotional and gripping drama.

Roma (2018) (Spanish with subtitles)

'Roma' won the Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film in 2019.

It spans a year in the life of a middle class family in Mexico City in the early 1970s, focussing particularly on the maid Cleo. A seemingly ordinary business trip to Quebec paves the way for bitter heartbreak. A slow paced emotionally draining drama, with stunning cinematography.
