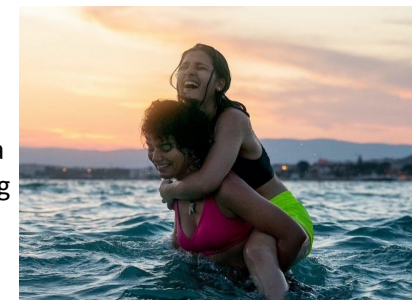

Double Bill with meal

Sat. 16th September 3:30pm

We kick off our new season with a double bill with meal. First up is **The Swimmers (2022)** Based on a true story, two young sisters embark on a harrowing journey from their home in war-torn Syria. Putting their hearts and swimming skills to heroic use, they help other refugees reach safety crossing the Aegean Sea in an overcrowded dinghy. Moving forward to 2016 the younger sister Yusra reaches the 2016 Rio Olympics in the Refugee Olympic Team.



We follow this with **The Swimmer (1968)**

Well off ad-man Ned Merrill (Burt Lancaster) is visiting a friend when he notices the abundance of backyard pools that populate their upscale suburb. Ned suddenly decides that he'd like to travel the eight miles back to his own home by simply swimming across every pool in town. As he stops in each pool his interactions tell his life story.

Denial (2016)

Thur. 21st September 7:30pm

When university professor Deborah E. Lipstadt (Rachel Weisz) includes World War II historian David Irving (Timothy Spall) in a book about Holocaust deniers, Irving accuses her of libel and sparks a legal battle for historical truth. Lipstadt and her legal team fight to prove the essential truth that the Holocaust occurred. BAFTA nominated.



Empire of Light (2022)

Thur. 26th October. 7:30pm



An Oscar nominated romantic drama about the power of human connection during turbulent times set in an English coastal town in the 1980s. Hilary (Olivia Colman) is a cinema manager struggling with her mental health, and Stephen (Michael Ward) is a new employee longing to escape the provincial town where he faces daily adversity. Together they find a sense of belonging and experience the healing power of music, cinema, and community. Directed and written by Sam Mendes.

Welcome To The Sticks (2008) (French with subtitles)



Thur. 30th November 7:30pm

The comic tale of Philippe who works for the Post Office in Provence. Caught trying to engineer a transfer to an office on the Riviera he is banished to Bergues in the far, far North. A cold and rainy place inhabited by unsophisticated “ch’tis” who speak a strange dialect. Strongly prejudiced against this chilly, inhospitable place, his intention is to move back as quickly as possible.

The Personal History of David Copperfield (2019)

Thur. 14th December 7:30pm

A modern spin on Charles Dickens' classic, semi-autobiographical masterpiece, which chronicles the life of David (Dev Patel) as he navigates a chaotic world to find his elusive place within it. David's journey is by turns hilarious and tragic, but always full of life, colour, and humanity. BAFTA nominated, Screenplay by Armando Iannucci. Also starring Hugh Laurie and Tilda Swinton.

Not Without My Daughter (1991)

Based on a true story, "Moody" (Alfred Molina) is an Iranian doctor living in America with his American wife Betty (Sally Field) and their child Mahtob. Wanting to see his homeland again, he convinces his wife to take a short holiday there with him and Mahtob. Betty is reluctant, and upon arrival in Iran, it appears that her worst fears are realised.



Sunshine on Leith (2013)

Featuring music by The Proclaimers this is a feel-good musical comedy. The film follows the stories of Davy MacKay and Ally, who have to re-learn how to live life in Edinburgh after coming home from serving in Afghanistan. Both struggle to learn to live a life outside the army and to deal with the everyday problems of family, jobs and relationships.



Age of Innocence (2018)

Tue. 30th January 7:30pm

This award winning film set in 1870's New York is an historical romantic period drama telling the story of high society courtship, marriage and romantic entanglements between a lawyer, his young fiancée and a countess.

Starring Michelle Pfeiffer, Daniel Day-Lewis, Winona Ryder and Miriam Margolyes.



A Man called Ove (2015) (Swedish with subtitles)

Thur. 29th February 7:30pm

Ove is an ill-tempered, isolated Swedish retiree who spends his days enforcing housing association rules and visiting his wife's grave. He has given up on life just as an unlikely friendship develops with his boisterous new neighbours. A drama comedy that is both sad and funny, this won several European film awards.
